ABSTRACT

With different religion in India there was also a difference in the marriage pattern of every religion from each other. This study has been undertaken with the main aim of knowing the marriage pattern of Sikhs in the urban area of Lucknow city. The study was conducted in area Alambagh of Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh, India. For the study, only Sikh religion of Alambagh area of Lucknow were chosen. The sample consisted of 50 respondents.
